# Your Pie

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Think Moe's or Subway, but with pizza. That's what Your Pie, a new pizza joint that recently opened on Woodruff Road, is all about.

"You really build your own pizza step by step," said general manager Chase Amason. "You choose your dough, then you choose your sauce, choose your pie."

The lineup at Your Pie includes the standard marinara, mozzarella and pepperoni choices, but there also are other options to help you craft a pizza to your personal liking.

Dough is available in white, wheat or gluten-free, and the eight available sauces run the gamut from barbecue to basil pesto, Thai and sundried tomato. Among the 10 cheese selections are gorgonzola, feta, ricotta, provolone and even a soy cheese.

Top your personal 10-inch pie with your choice of nearly 20 fresh ingredients (mushrooms, olives, carrots, corn, spinach, onions, oregano, etc.) and 16 premium ingredients (bacon, pecans, ham, meatballs, to-fu, artichoke hearts, etc.).

Sauces, cheeses and fresh ingredients are all included in the \$6.50 price. Mix and match to your heart's content. Add premi-

um ingredients for 50 cents each.

"We like for people to get creative like that. It makes it a little more fun for us," Amason said.

Your Pie also offers a menu of "favorites," essentially pre-designed pizzas, which can also be personalized to your liking. Leading choices include the Nat (basil pesto sauce, mozzarella, feta, chicken, spinach and sun-dried tomatoes), the lineage (Your Pie's version of a supreme pizza) and the Ischia (garlic and olive oil base with mozzarella, Roma tomatoes, basil and garlic).

The Ischia, named for an Italian island, is reportedly the first modern pizza created, made with the green, red and white of the Italian flag and presented to the

queen of Italy in the late 19<sup>th</sup> century.

Or try the Southern Heat (hot sauce, chicken, jalapeños, red onions, mozzarella and ranch or blue cheese) or the Thai Pie (spicy Thai sauce, cheddar, chicken, carrots, corn, red onions and cilantro).

Your Pie also offers paninis, calzones and salads (served in a bread bowl), all built to taste in the same fashion as the pizzas.

An available kids' meal comes with a smaller pizza and a serving of gelato.

The Greenville Your Pie is the ninth in a chain that

got started in Athens, Ga., about three years ago, Amason said. Find it at 1461 Woodruff Road, Suite E.
